I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Termination of sentence and respectfully represent as follows:

First-- That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Embezzlement

Second-- I was convicted and sentenced on the 24th day of May, A. D. 1926, at Price, County of Carbon and State of Utah, in Seventh Judicial Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge Christenson presiding.

Third-- I was sentenced to an Indeterminate Term and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison from May 24, 1926 to December 19, 1926 and since that time have been on parole.

Fourth-- Honorable District Attorney Keller prosecuted the case.
