Dear Sir:

I am in receipt of your favor of the 18th inst. in which you say that you intend to apply to the Board of Pardons for release from imprisonment and that said application will come before the board at the June meeting. You also request that I recommend to the Board of Pardons that you be released.

I remember vividly your conduct in court at the time of your sentence. It was in one way a surprise to me in view of the fact that you had entered a plea of guilty, but I concluded that you must have been laboring under some unusual mental excitement and as far as that conduct is concerned I assure you it did not influence me at the time I recommended to the Board your term of imprisonment, nor does it influence me at this time. I am going to take your word at par and will recommend your case to the favorable consideration of the Board of Pardons.

I trust that what you say is true, namely, that you have learned your lesson well and I hope that your future will be free from acts which will bring upon you the penalties of the law. You have an opportunity to make good, notwithstanding the experience of your present situation, and I hope you will conduct yourself manfully and with a proper regard for the rights of others when you are released.

I will ask the Warden as to your conduct and my recommendation will be conditioned upon a favorable report from him.
