Gentlemen:-

In re State of Utah vs. John Wells.

On September 7th, 1923, John Wells pled guilty to an information charging him with the crime of burglary in the third degree. The crime consisted of his taking an automobile and using the same without permission from the owner. Upon his plea of guilty he was adjudged to be imprisoned in the State Prison for not less than six months nor more than three years. At the time of imposing judgment I was informed by the District Attorney that the case was not an aggravated one and that under the circumstances surrounding the case, imprisonment for six months would be ample punishment; and I therefore recommend that John Wells' sentence be terminated at the expiration of six months from said September 7th.
