And whereas, petitioner, believes that the object of prosecution of said cause has been accomplished, and that even if petitioner were guilty, he has been sufficiently punished to make him realize in full the fruitlessness of a life of crime.

NOW THEREFORE, said petitioner respectfully requests your Honorable Body to pardon him, that he may be enabled to go forth and enjoy the freedom to which he feels he is entitled.
