Haven't they been on friendly terms for several months?

MR. GORDON: Judge Tobin, I would not like to discuss that with you, because I don't think it is anything that could <sup>come</sup> ~~go~~ up in this court.

MR. TOBIN: This is for the Board of Pardons. I am just showing the relations of these parties prior to the commission of this offense. I am not disputing anything you say. This is only for the Board of Pardons.

THE COURT:
