Gentlemen:

The defendant in the case of the State of Utah -vs- Charles Freidman, has made application to me for a further statement to your Honorable Board in regard to his application which will come up for consideration at the meeting of the Board of Pardons on the 26th instant.

Mr. Freidman assures me that he has learned his lesson well, and that he has a good record at the State Prison and believes that he has the confidence of the Prison Officials.

He fails to advise me just what is the nature of his application. In view of the fact that he is very young and in consideration of the circumstances attending his conviction more than a year ago, I desire to state that while in my recommendation his incarceration was for five years, I am not averse to any action that your Honorable Board may, upon a full investigation of the said case, feel to be right and proper in this matter.

At the time of his conviction the District Attorney made a strong plea for leniency for said defendant and the Court then recommended the minimum sentence of five years although the Court at that time was rather strongly moved to recommend a somewhat shorter term.
