STATEMENT TO THE BOARD OF PARDONS.

Hon. State Board of Pardons,  
State Capitol,  
Salt Lake City, Utah.

Gentlemen:

I am herewith submitting report of proceedings and facts  
in the above-entitled cause.

The defendant in this case was arraigned in this Court  
on the 31st day of March, 1924, and was, upon his own plea  
of guilty, convicted of Burglary in the Second Degree. The  
defendant waived the statutory time for the pronouncing of  
judgment and asked that judgment be pronounced forthwith.  
Thereupon, on the said 31st day of March, 1924, the said  
defendant was by this Court sentenced to an indeterminate  
period of imprisonment in the State Prison of the State of  
Utah, of not less than one year nor more than twenty years.

It was made to appear to the Court that the defendant  
broke and entered into the home and dwelling place of J. C.  
Vaught of Price, Carbon County, Utah, with intent to steal,  
but the return of Mr. Vaught prevented the larceny, and the  
defendant was arrested and taken to jail. The defendant  
pleaded that he entered the house for the purpose of obtain-  
ing food, he being at that time famished. It further appeared  
that the defendant, who is less than 21 years of age began  
life by stepping off on the wrong foot, and was sometime here-  
tofore committed to the Reform School at Buena Vista, Colorado.  
Breaking his parole from that institution he came to Utah and  
shortly after was in the toils of the law as above stated.

In view of the extreme youth of the defendant, and the  
recommendation of the District Attorney, this Court hereby  
recommends that the said defendant be imprisoned in the State  
Prison of the State of Utah for a period of five years,  
provided that the conduct of the said defendant while thus  
incarcerated shall be proper and commendable.
