Application of JAMES BAUDINO for Termination of Sentence.

On the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Termination of Sentence and respectfully represent as follows:

First--That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Penitentiary under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Persistent Violator of the Liquor Laws

Second--I was convicted and sentenced on the 23rd. day of September A. D. 1925, at Manti City County of Sanpete and State of Utah, in the District Court Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable Dilworth Woolley presiding.

Third--I was sentenced to an Indeterminate term of not less than three months or more than two years and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Penitentiary

Fourth--Honorable F. W. Keller (Price, Utah) prosecuted the case.

Fifth--My true name in full is James Baudino

I was convicted under the name of James Baudino

Sixth--The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows: Dan Baudino, Newhouse, Utah, was with me at the time of the alleged offense. He entered a plea of guilty to a charge of Possession of Intoxicating Liquor in the Justice Court in and for Manti Precinct, Sanpete County, Utah, before C. P. Larsen, Justice of the Peace, and fined \$150.00 which he paid, June 29, 1925.

Seventh--I have never been convicted of any offense except Entered a plea of guilty to charge of Possession of Intoxicating Liquors in the Justice Court in and for Richfield Precinct, Sevier County, Utah, before S. G. Clark, Justice of the Peace, August 22, 1921, and paid fine of \$150.00.
