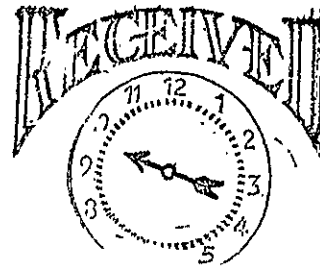

I, John Smiley, being first duly sworn,

on oath, deposes and says:

That he is confined in the Utah State Prison by virtue of a commitment from the Fifth Judicial District, County of Juab, for Burglary, 3rd Degree, having been received August 28th, 1923.

That his application for Termination of Sentence was considered and denied at the meeting of the Board of Pardons held March 20th, and 24th, 1925.

That since that time his health has constantly declined, due to a injury received when a young man 22 years old, in which he received a broken back and internal injuries, which has left him crippled for life.

That it is his desire to leave the State of Utah, and go to a place where he can start work and regain his health.

That by trade he is a shoe-maker, and is capable of making an honest living at that trade.

That the only trouble previous was a conviction in California, for which he was proven innocent and was released after an imprisonment of 10 months.

Attached to, and made a part of this affidavit, is a letter to the Honorable Board of Pardons, to which their attention is respectfully invited.

Wherefore, petitioner, prays the Board of Pardons for a re-hearing of his application for Termination of sentence, to the end that he may be given his liberty for the reasons and purpose outlined above.
