A day or two later, to be exact the day before the homicide, he, the Applicant, entered complaint against his brother-in-law, the father of the said children, in the Juvenile Court and after this it simply added to the fear and culminated in his present trouble/

I have been asked to and did accompany Attorney Hamilton with a Notary Public into the presence of the above named Peter and Mrs. Peter Nickolopoulos, Gust Nickolopoulos, who have made affidavits in behalf of James Nickolopoulos and carefully explained the contents of their affidavits in order that there would be no mistake or misrepresentation made to the honorable Board of Pardon of the State of Utah. *I knew Dan Karras the deceased and that he and the applicant were the warmest and best of friends -*
