Being first duly sworn I, Peter Nickolopoulos, on my oath depose and say: that I am of the age of 20 years; that I have resided in the United States 12 years, last past, in Salt Lake City, Utah; that I am a man of family consisting of a wife and seven children ranging from one to twelve years of age, all of whom are now wholly dependent on me for support; that since coming to the United States I have been engaged the principal part of the time as a laborer, and for about 12 years prior to the trouble my brother, James Nickolopoulos, had in November, 1921, I was engaged in the grocery business with him in Salt Lake City, but the expense involved in his trouble caused us to lose our little store and me to return to my work as a laborer.

My father, Gust Nickolopoulos, is quite old and feeble and has been for 12 years during which time he has been dependent upon my brother James and myself.

While I am continuing at work, I have at this time and for 2 years last past, been unable to do ^{as hard} manual labor because of sickness, but I am not and have not asked for assistance nor will I do so as long as I have any strength of mind or body.

I further depose and say that I am a brother-in-law to Gust Tryfonopoulos, the father of Helen and Antonia; that until this trouble came up my brother-in-law and his family were on friendly terms with all of us. He was a man, who at times with his associates other than my family, ~~who~~ would display a very bad temper and was of such strength and determination as to be feared when in such state of mind.

A short time before the homicide in question, Antonia, above referred to, informed me and others of my family and as well my brother
