Laurine Friend Callender, being first duly sworn on oath, deposes and says: That she is the wife of Fred B. Callender; that her only source of income is from her services as a professional performer and actress; that since the arrest of said Fred B. Callender, she has been unable to obtain remunerative and continuous employment in the State of Utah; that an opportunity now presents itself to affiant to enter into a twenty-eight weeks contract with the Ship Cafe at Venice, California for a compensation of \$250.00 per week, provided said contract can be entered into by affiant and her husband, Fred B. Callender; that unless the sentence of said Fred B. Callender is terminated before April 15th, 1925, at which time affiant and said Callender must appear at Venice, California, said opportunity for employment will be lost to affiant; that it is therefore necessary that the petition of Fred B. Callender be heard at the next meeting of the Board of Pardons of the State of Utah; that the mother of said Callender is ill and in need of assistance from her said son, upon whom she has heretofore been partially dependent; that affiant has corresponded with Booking Agencies in San Francisco through whom affiant and said Callender has heretofore obtained employment and has found that there is no demand at any of said Booking Agencies for their services and no likelihood for their services in the immediate future; that affiant believes said contract offered by the Ship Cafe to be her only immediate means of obtaining employment and that unless the sentence of the said Callender is terminated on or before April 15th, affiant will not be able to obtain said contract of employment.
