Later on she had occasion to go in there and discovered that the money was gone, that is there was \$90.00 taken, \$85.00 in greenbacks and \$5.00 in silver was left, and accused this defendant of it. He was accused of it and denied it. However, he had his hearing, and the Justice found the evidence sufficient to bind him over to the District Court.

Later on he informed the Sheriff that he did take the money and told them where it was hidden. Pat Sullivan, the owner of the house told the defendant to remain in his seat in the room there until he obtained an officer so he could be put under arrest, and while he was gone the defendant took the money and put it in a slit in the wall in the paper in the toilet, but the money was found there and they recovered it and the sheriff has the money.

After the defendant came to Coalville he informed the sheriff, Clark, that he took the money and told him where he could get it.

THE COURT: So on his information as to where the money was, it was recovered?

MR. JOHNSON: The sheriff informs me that there was a partner of his stopping at the same place and he was the one that took the money and this defendant put it back in the toilet. However, we have been unable to find any evidence to corroborate the defendant's statement.

THE COURT: I see. How long have you known the defendant?

MR. JOHNSON: Just since he was here arrested on the 27th.
