Application of Benjamin James Baugh

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Parole  
and respectfully represent as follows:

First-- That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison  
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Forgery

Second-- I was convicted and sentenced on the 26<sup>th</sup> day of June  
A. D. 1925, at Richfield Utah County of Sevier  
and State of Utah, in Sixth District Court, in and for the  
County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge Bates presiding.

Third-- I was sentenced to One year to Twenty  
years  
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison

Fourth-- Honorable Henry Beal prosecuted the case.

Fifth-- My true name in full is Benjamin James Baugh  
I was convicted under the name of as above

Sixth-- The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are  
as follows: Mr Fred Meldrum

Seventh-- I have never been convicted of any offense except as above  
At the time of this happening I was not aware  
of the seriousness that it was bringing  
upon my good name. I regret this very much  
and feel the sting that it is bringing upon  
the good name of my parents. As I am the  
first one out of my Respectfully submitted,  
entire relationship that  
has been committed Benjamin James Baugh  
to an institution of  
this kind.  
If I am granted a parole I will do my best  
to avoid any trouble hereafter.
