First-- That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Forgery

Second-- I was convicted and sentenced on the 20th day of February
A. D. 1924, at Ogden County of Weber
and State of Utah, in 2nd Judicial District Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge George S. Barker presiding.

Third-- I was sentenced to an indeterminate term in
the Utah State Prison
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison

Fourth-- Honorable Joseph E. Evans prosecuted the case.

Fifth-- My true name in full is William Hardie Hartell
I was convicted under the name of William H. Hartell

Sixth-- The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are
as follows: none

Seventh-- I have never been convicted of any offense except I am a
passive violator of San Quentin on
a charge of fictitious checks.
