In re W. H. Hartell,
Application for Parole.

The above-named W. H. Hartell was charged by the District Attorney of the Second Judicial District, in and information filed in the District Court of said District, in and for Weber County, Utah, with the crime of Forgery, alleged to have been committed as follows, to wit:

The said Defendant, on February 15, 1924, at the County of Weber, State of Utah, wilfully, unlawfully, fraudulently and feloniously, with intent to defraud James L. Johns and W. H. Wright and Sons, a Utah Corporation, with its principal place of business at Ogden, Utah, forged the name of said James L. Johns by then and there endorsing the same on a certain check and order for the payment of money, said check and order being in the words and figures following:

To James L. Johns, Dr.
Pay \$92 and 34 cts Dollars, \$92.34
in full for services rendered during period
Jan. 16 to Jan 31, 1924. When signed by the
cashier or his duly authorized representative
and properly endorsed by payee, this voucher
becomes a sight draft on this company and is
payable at the office of the company at Ogden,
Utah.
