Gentlemen;

We, the undersigned, E. E. Anderson, (Vice-President of Morgan County Board of Education and Bishop of North Morgan Ward of the L.D.S. Church) and R. R. Fry, (Mayor of Morgan City); do hereby request that your honorable body take favorable action upon the application of Lafayette Heiner for release from imprisonment from the Weber County prison, to which he was sent as the result of conviction for the violation of the Prohibition Law.

Mr. Heiner is a farmer by occupation and the season is now fast approaching when his land must be made ready for the planting of crops. He is also a man of family, having a wife and seven children who are greatly in need of the support which he could render them.

Mr. Heiner has now served something over six weeks of his ninety day sentence and we believe that the ends of justice have been served as this, we believe, was his first offense.

We feel sure that in case he is released from imprisonment that he will be an industrious, law abiding citizen.

Trusting that your honorable board will see fit to grant pardon to Mr. Lafayette Heiner, we remain,
