
Ben J. Hett, being first duly sworn on oath, deposes and says that he is a resident of the City of Wausau, Marathon County, Wisconsin, and a brother of William Hett who died in 1907. My brother, William Hett, was the father of four children, one of them being a son Harry Hett. The mother died four or five years later.

When Harry Hett was about six or seven years old he was sick with cerebro-spinal meningitis and for a long time was not expected to live.


After that sickness Harry never was the same boy. Before his sickness he was like other children of his age, but afterwards he never developed like other children and acted so queerly at times that we all talked about it.

I do not now remember some of the queer things done by Harry, but I remember positively that after his sickness he was never right mentally. During the late war he tried to enlist in the United States Army, but he was rejected because of his mental and physical condition.

I understand that Harry Hett, under the assumed name of George Allen, has been sentenced to death for the murder of a policeman at Salt Lake City, the execution to take place on March 21, 1924.
