Dear Judge:

You remember Billy Hett, the former mail carrier and member of Company G, and you will remember that he died about sixteen years ago.

Billy left four children, one of them being a boy Harry. The mother died four years later.

It just came to me last week that this boy Harry Hett, under the assumed name of George Allen, killed a policeman at Salt Lake City last November and is sentenced to be shot on March 21, 1924.

I understand that the relatives here sent some money to help retain an attorney, who defended the boy at the trial, but after the sentence nothing further was done.

Now, I have not been retained by any one; but in view of what I hear of this boy Harry, it seems that some of the old friends of Billy Hett ought to do all within their power to secure a commutation of sentence for Harry. It seems that the boy has never been quite right after a severe attack of cerebro-spinal meningitis which he had when he was about six years old and it seems, too, that he never developed like the average boy. The enclosed affidavits will give you light on the situation.

Now, what I ask of you and hope that you will do is to see Governor Blaine immediately, and implore him to ask for the clemency of the boy. If he will do this, then have the affidavits forwarded by the Governor to the Governor of Utah with his letter.
