Application of W. S. Blackburn

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Termination  
and respectfully represent as follows:

First-- That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison  
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Grand Larceny

Second-- I was convicted and sentenced on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of January  
A. D. 1914, at Castle Dale County of Emery  
and State of Utah, in Seventh Judicial District Court, in and for the  
County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge Christensen presiding.

Third-- I was sentenced to an indeterminate  
sentence of from one to ten years  
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison  
from February 16<sup>th</sup> to June 20<sup>th</sup>

Fourth-- Honorable B. W. Walton prosecuted the case.

Fifth-- My true name in full is William Sheridan Blackburn  
I was convicted under the name of W. S. Blackburn

Sixth-- The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are  
as follows: James E. Randall and  
Frank M. Randall

Seventh-- I have never been convicted of any offense except this one.  
• I think I have been amply punished  
for the crime committed and I should  
like now to become a citizen of the  
United States, again if it be your  
pleasure to grant me this privilege.
