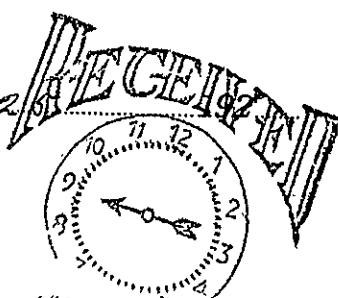

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a termination
and respectfully represent as follows:

First-- That I am serving a term of imprisonment in the Utah State Prison
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Grand larceny

Second-- I was convicted and sentenced on the 30 day of January,
A. D. 1924, at Castle Dale County of Cornwall
and State of Utah, in Seventh judicial district Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge George Christensen presiding.

Third-- I was sentenced to an indeterminate sentence of
from one to ten years
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison on the
sixteenth day of February 1924, and was paroled
to Mr. E. E. Branch on the 20th day of June 1924.

Fourth-- Honorable B. W. Walton prosecuted the case.

Fifth-- My true name in full is William Sheridan Blackburn
I was convicted under the name of W. S. Blackburn

Sixth-- The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are
as follows: James E. Randall and Frank M. Randall

Seventh-- I have never been convicted of any offense except this one
I am a sheep shearer and as a good deal
of that work is done in the state of Wyoming
I should like very much to be permitted to
go up there this spring for that work, and of
course this will be impossible under present conditions.
