

THE COURT: Let the plea be entered then. Just be seated, Mr. Johnson.

MR. ROGERS: What were you charged with in the Federal Court?

DEFENDANT: Trying to obtain money under false pretenses.

THE COURT: That is not usually a federal charge.

DEFENDANT: No, but it is concerning some stamps in the Treasury Department.

MR. ROGERS: And you have been in trouble with the Juvenile Court, haven't you?

DEFENDANT: I was when I was fourteen.

THE COURT: Are your parents living?

DEFENDANT: My father is.

THE COURT: At Delta?

DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.
