Dear Sir:

Herewith is application of Astuchika Sugiyama for a pardon, which kindly present to the Board of Pardons at its next meeting.

I firmly believe that the prisoner has been sufficiently punished. He pleaded guilty in the City Court of Ogden City Utah on May 16th. to the charge of having liquor in his possession. He was sentenced to 180 days in the County Jail and since that date has been continuously confined.

He is seventy-one years old and in poor health and physically infirm. Furthermore the sanitary and other conditions of the Weber County Jail are bad and the State Board of Health has caused proceedings to be instituted to have the Jail condemned.

The prisoner tells me that he has resided in the United States for forty years and has never before been convicted of any offense and promises to obey all the laws and especially the liquor laws if pardoned.

Therefore, under the circumstances I do not hesitate to ask for favorable consideration by the Board.
