

THE COURT: What is the section of the statute?

MR. HIGGINS: It is in the special session of 1915. Mr. Murdock has gone downstairs to get it.

THE COURT: My the record show that the defendants are ready to receive sentence at this time?

MR. WOODBURY: Yes.

THE COURT: You defendants come around here, will you? Each of you have consulted with the attorney the court appointed for you?

ALL DEFENDANTS: Yes, sir.

THE COURT: Are you ready to enter your plea to the information at this time?

THE DEFENDANTS: Yes.

MR. HIGGINS: It has not been read.

THE COURT: Oh yes. You will listen to the reading of the information, and you can enter your plea later.

(Clerk reads information to the defendants, and defendants are furnished a copy of the same)

THE COURT: The record may show that a copy of the information was handed to the defendants. You are ready to plead at this time, is that right?

THE DEFENDANTS: Yes, sir.

THE COURT: What is your plea?

THE DEFENDANTS: Guilty.

THE COURT: That is the plea of each one of you?

THE DEFENDANTS: Yes, sir.

THE COURT: What is the law in relation to this matter?

MR. HIGGINS: Chapter 5 of the Special Session of 1915.

THE COURT: Chapter 5?

MR. HIGGINS: Yes. Which reads as follows:
