

MR. CARLSON: What is the charge?

THE COURT: He is charged with robbery.

MR. CARLSON: May I have a minute with the defendant?

THE COURT: Yes. You may go into my chambers, or the room there to your left. (Consultation)

MR. ROGERS: I understand, in the case of State Vs Marra, the defendant is now ready to enter his plea.

THE COURT: The Clerk may read the Information. (Read)

THE COURT: Mr. Marra, to the Information that has been read to you, what is your plea, Guilty or Not Guilty?

A Guilty.

THE COURT: Let the plea be entered. Are you ready at this time for the sentence of the Court?

A Yes sir.

THE COURT: You have consulted with him on this question, have you, Mr. Carlson?

MR. CARLSON: Yes, sir. I have talked to him about the facts, and there are I suppose some situations there that might be explained; but I understand that the District Attorney will make a recommendation.

MR. ROGERS: If the Court please-- In this case we recommend the minimum sentence, which is five years.

THE COURT:

Q How old a man are you, Mr. Marra? A. Eighteen.

Q Eighteen? A. Yes sir.

Q When were you eighteen? A. I was eighteen-- I will be eighteen on the 28th of December.

Q You were eighteen on the 28th of December?

A I will be eighteen on the 28th of December.

Q Then you are only seventeen; is that right? A. Yes sir. I was born in 1905, the 28th of December.
