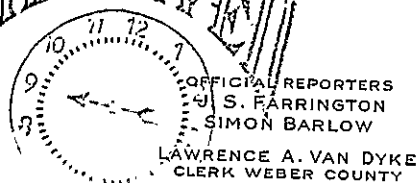

Gentlemen;

In re Application of Herman Smith for
Termination of sentence.

This man was adjudged by this court, September 8, 1924, to imprisonment for Voluntary Manslaughter, on his plea of guilty to that offense, upon an information charging him with Murder in the First Degree.

The plea of voluntary manslaughter was accepted by the Court on the recommendation of the District Attorney, and, from the history of the case, I think the District Attorney was justified in making the recommendation and the Court justified in accepting the plea of guilty of voluntary manslaughter to the information.

I am enclosing herewith a transcript of the evidence taken at the Preliminary Examination, which contains a full history of the case.

I believe from the history of the case that a pardon should be granted him at this time.
