Dear Sir:-

I note what your friend, Mr. W.E. Schoppe, has to say regarding Mr. Ryan's citizenship.

In reply thereto will say that the fact that Mr. Ryan was convicted of a felony does not deprive him of his citizenship; it merely deprives him of the right to serve on a jury in this state. Of course, if he desires to be restored to all of his former rights, such as acting as a juror, etc., it will be necessary for him to secure a pardon from the Board of Pardons. If he will make application to the Board for a pardon and get such application to me before the 1st of March, I think the Board will be willing to grant the same in view of what your friend has to say regarding him.
