Application of Fred Wedmer

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a termination of sentence, and respectfully represent as follows:

First-- That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison, under conviction and a sentence on a charge of forgery,

Second-- I was convicted and sentenced on the 26th day of May, A. D. 1924, at Salt Lake City, County of Salt Lake, and State of Utah, in Third District Court Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable M. L. Ritchie, presiding.

Third-- I was sentenced to an indeterminate term, and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison.

Fourth-- Honorable E. A. Rogers, prosecuted the case.

Fifth-- My true name in full is Fred Wedmer, I was convicted under the name of Fred Wedmer,

Sixth-- The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows: none.

Seventh-- I have never been convicted of any offense except (First Offence) Sentenced May 26th, 1924, Sentence was suspended at the time, Received at Prison, October 15th, 1924, Suspended Sentence from Bench
