Application of James Mendez, No. 5168.

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a termination and respectfully represent as follows:

First-That I am serving a term of imprisonment in the Utah State Prison under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Grand Larceny.

Second-I was convicted and sentenced on the 23rd day of March A. D. 1929, at Salt Lake City, County of Salt Lake and State of Utah, in 2nd. District Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge Moffit presiding.

Third-I was sentenced to one to ten years

and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison

Fourth-Honorable Ray Van Cott prosecuted the case.

Fifth-My true name in full is James Mendez.

I was convicted under the name of James Mendez.

Sixth-The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows:

Seventh-I have never been convicted of any offense except to one felony charge, previous to this one.
