Application of Ben. F. Carter

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a termination of sentence and respectfully represent as follows:

First-- That I am serving a term of imprisonment in the Utah State Prison under conviction and a sentence on a charge of second degree murder or about

Second-- I was convicted and sentenced on the 26th day of September, A. D. 1921, at Richfield, County of Sevier and State of Utah, in the Sixth Judicial District Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable Joseph H. Erickson, Judge, presiding.

Third-- I was sentenced to life imprisonment.

and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison October 7, 1921, where I remained until May 15, 1926, when I was paroled by your Honorable Board.

Fourth-- Honorable Nephi J. Bates prosecuted the case.

Fifth-- My true name in full is Ben. F. Carter
I was convicted under the name of Ben. F. Carter.

Sixth-- The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows: None.

Seventh-- I have never been convicted of any offense except the one herein mentioned, and another offense a great many years ago, for which I did service for a short time in the Utah State Prison.

I have kept my parole requirements honestly and faithfully since you granted my parole on May 15, 1925.
