Q Have you been a decent, orderly young man since you came to Utah?
A. Yes sir.

Q THE COURT: Mr. Johnson, do you know anything about this affair?

MR. JOHNSON (County Attorney): I know something about it. I can do that very easily where men are criminals and whose records have been such that society demands protection from them; but it is a very difficult thing, where I see young men just starting out in life, and who, on account of a situation such as this, have to be handicapped
