To the Honorable the Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

The petition of A. Sherman Anderson respectfully shows to your Honorable Board:

1. That on May 12, 1925 in the District Court of Weber County, Utah I was convicted of having intoxicating liquor in my possession; to-wit, one-half pint of whisky, and on May 14, 1925 I was sentenced to serve six months in the Weber County jail where I am now imprisoned. I began my sentence May 19, 1925, and was then let out on bail pending a motion for a new trial, and was re-committed May 26, 1925. Joseph E. Evans, District Attorney, was the prosecuting officer. No other persons were connected with the offense.

2. I am asking clemency on the following grounds:

(1) That I am 22 years of age, in good health, and have always been a hard working man as a farmer, and as a blacksmith's helper for about two years all told between seasons.

(2) My father needs me on the farm at Burch Creek, Weber County, Utah during this busy season, where I'll go home to work when released from prison.

(3) I have never been charged with any offense prior to this charge, and was never arrested before this difficulty came.
