Application of Joseph E. Marenger

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Termination
and respectfully represent as follows:

First-That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Second degree Murder

Second-I was convicted and sentenced on the Fourth day of September
A. D. 1924, at Salt Lake City County of Salt Lake
and State of Utah, in Third District Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge McCreary presiding.

Third-I was sentenced to an indeterminate sentence of from five
years to life
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison

Fourth-Honorable E. A. Rogers prosecuted the case.

Fifth-My true name in full is Joseph E. Marenger
I was convicted under the name of Joseph E. Marenger

Sixth-The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are
as follows: N. E. White and R. W. Seyboldt

Seventh-I have never been convicted of any offense except as shown on records
