A number of Bell County and other Eastern Kentucky people have interested themselves in securing a pardon or parole for Fred Hopkins, formerly of this city who was convicted and sentenced to imprisonment in Utah last September.

We have taken the matter up through interested friends in Utah with the governor of that state. We believe that you can help the matter materially by writing to the governor of Utah at Salt Lake City, ofcourse, stating that you know nothing about the case but that those of us who are interested are reliable and would not misrepresent the facts to him. If you will do this we will be under renewed obligations to you.

I see in the paper that Mrs. Fields is quite sick. I hope that she is much better by this time.
