PINEVILLE, the Gem City of the Cumberlands, is situated in the heart of the Cumberland Mountains, which tower more than 2,200 feet above sea level. The climate is bracing and invigorating and throughout the summer blankets are needed at night for sleeping. Pineville's scenery is unmatched. Cumberland River, famous for its small-mouth black bass, winds its way through the picturesque Cumberland Mountains. Clear Creek Mountain Springs, a short drive from the city, provides health-giving mineral waters and an abundance of unsurpassed scenery. Pineville has excellent hotel facilities; the entire city is paved; hard-surfaced roads radiate from Pineville, the connecting point for the rich Harlan and Bell County coal fields. The Kentucky Utilities Company's super-power plant on the beautiful Cumberland River, the most modern steam generating plant in the Southland, is located here. Pineville is situated on a direct line between the resorts of the North and the South. It is on the original Daniel Boone Trail and is an ideal day's drive from either Cincinnati, Louisville, Chattanooga or Asheville. Mountain climbing, bass fishing, swimming, motoring and golfing provide ample recreation. Visit Cumberland Gap and follow the old Wilderness Trail passed over by Dr. Thomas Walker and Daniel Boone.
