Dear Mr. Tracy;

In Re; Application Glenn H. Learned  
for termination of sentence.

In my last conversation with you relative to the  
above matter I stated no steps of any kind would be taken  
until Learned had served the full time recommended by  
the Judge who sentenced him, Judge Ephraim Hanson.

I also stated to you I would take no action with-  
out notifying you of my intention to do so.

Learned was sentenced by Judge Hanson to an inde-  
terminate term. Judge Hanson by letter recommended he  
serve one year. The sentence was imposed on the 16th.  
day of September 1922. The one year, then, will expire  
on September 16 1923.

I am advised the Board of Pardons will meet on the  
21st. and 22nd. day of September 1923, at State Prison.

I am preparing and shall file at once an application  
for termination of sentence on behalf of Learned. This  
will be mailed to the Attorney General of this State and  
by him filed with the State Board of Pardons.
