Dear Judge Hanson;

I am preparing an application for parole on behalf of Mr. Glen H. Learned who, on September 16 1922, entered a plea of guilty before you to the offense of grand larceny and embezzlement. One information in which were two counts. On the same day you sentenced Mr. Learned to the State Penitentiary under the indeterminate sentence statute.

The commitment, on return, was filed with the Clerk of your Court on the 21st. day of September 1922.
