To The Hon. Board of Pardons
of the State of Utah:

GENTLEMEN:

In accordance with the provisions of Sections 9062 and 9064 of the Compiled Laws of Utah, 1917, I herewith transmit in duplicate the statement required by the Statute:

This defendant on September 4th, at the time of calling the jury, changed his plea of not guilty to that of guilty, on an information charging that on the 22nd of April, 1922, he stole jewelry and money of the value of approximately \$5000.00. It was made to appear that he went to the home of a Mrs. Cowans in Federal Heights, and represented himself to be a meter expert in the employ of the Utah Power and Light Company, and in this capacity obtained entrance to the home, and while in the house he stole the aforesaid property. None of the property has been recovered. He then went to Nevada and committed a similar offense, for which he served 20 months in the Nevada State penitentiary, and is now on parol from that institution, under a sentence of from one to fourteen years. He is wanted in several other cities for similar offenses. He is married and has a wife and two children living in California. His mother and father are also living. He claims to be twenty nine years of age. He has been detained in the county jail here for approximately six months awaiting trial.
