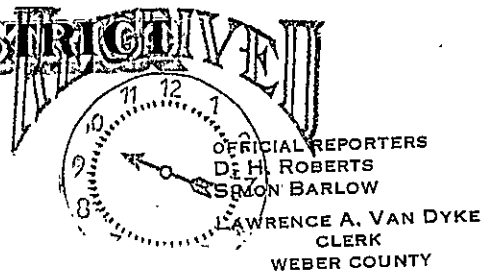

RE The State v Edward Romberg

This defendant on April 18, 1925, at Farmington, before Judge Kimball, entered a plea of guilty to the charge of Polygamy, and was thereupon sentenced to serve not exceeding five years in the State Prison.

Romberg stated that his first wife had deserted him and gone to California and had later written him that she had obtained a divorce; and believing that she really had done this he went to Farmington and married the prosecutrix in this case, who left him when she found out he was already married.

I recommend that his sentence be terminated at the coming June meeting of the Board of Pardons.
