

understood they were to be divorced sometime in the future and she left for Portland, Oregon, and the defendant followed, did you not?

DEFENDANT: I did.

MR. HUTCHINSON: And met her there and she and he returned to Salt Lake and resided here as husband and wife. She has a child, I was informed eleven months of age; he states nine months.

DEFENDANT: It may be nine or eleven.

MR. HUTCHINSON: Which he has denied to his wife as being his, but he tells me, as far as he knows, it is his child, and they lived here some two months, did you not?

DEFENDANT: Somewhere near two months, yes, sir.

THE COURT: This information is important for the Board of Parole and Pardons rather than for me, for I have no option in the matter, except to impose sentence, an indeterminate sentence. The sentence of the court is that you be confined in the Utah State Penitentiary for an indeterminate period and you are committed to the custody of the sheriff to see that this judgment is carried into execution. I will make such recommendation as seems proper to the Board. That is all.
