THE COURT: You understand that when you came down there, Mr. Moe? What is your age, Mr. Moe?

DEFENDANT MOE: Nineteen.

THE COURT: And yours, Mr. Hammer?

DEFENDANT HAMMER: Forty-four, forty-five tomorrow.

THE COURT: Stand up, gentlemen. It is the judgment and sentence of this court that you and each of you be confined in the State Penitentiary. The Court will make a recommendation to the Board of Pardons after getting the written report from the County Attorney. That will be all. You may be seated.
