MR. ROGERS: Yes, Your Honor. Step forward.

THE COURT: Step forward, gentlemen. There is an information against you.

(Information read to defendants by the clerk.)

MR. ROGERS: It should be the 10th day of October, Your Honor, I ask permission to amend the information.

THE COURT: The information may be amended in that particular. Let the record show the reading of the information and the delivery of a copy thereof to each of the defendants at this time.

THE COURT: The Court advises you that you have a right to take time to plead to this information, if you wish to, for the purpose of securing counsel or for any other purpose that appeals to you as requiring time, or you can plead now, if you please. Which is Mr. Templeton:

DEFENDANT TEMPLETON: Here.

THE COURT: Mr. Templeton, do you wish to take time or do you want to plead now?

DEFENDANT TEMPLETON: Plead now.

THE COURT: You want to plead now. What is your plea to this information, guilty or not guilty?

DEFENDANT TEMPLETON: Guilty.

THE COURT: Let the plea of Mr. Fred Templeton be entered of guilty.

THE COURT: Which is Mr. White? Mr. White, do you wish to take time to plead or do you want to waive time and plead now?

DEFENDANT WHITE: I wish to plead now, Your Honor.
