

To the Honorable Board of Pardons:

Gentlemen:

In case No.325 the State of Utah vs Joseph Ormond and Pete Robert Johnson the defendants were arrested charged with Burgulary in breaking an entering a railroad car.The Complaint was sworn to before the Committing Magistrate by Wm.F. Knowles agent for the O. S.L. railroad. The trial was had August 13th 1923 and the jury found the defendants guilty and they added "We recommend all the leniency the court can grant". The court recommended that sentence be terminated at the end of six months and the Court further stated in his report to the Board of Pardons that the defendants were in the county jail here three months awaiting trial and the Court recommended that they be allowed credit for the three months spent in the county jail at Brigham City.

In accordance with the verdict of the jury I recommend all the leniency the court can grant-and I recommend a pardon.
