Dear Mr. Cluff:

My attention has been called to the application of Gust Zaharopolous for termination of his sentence on the crime of Pandering.

To me, to grant any application for leniency to this man would be an open slap at the prosecuting and enforcing officers of the state. He has been convicted of murdering his wife and was sentenced for that crime and was pardoned. As soon as he was out of the prison he began an active violation of the law in manufacturing and selling intoxicating liquors and in running houses of prostitution. We have convicted him in Carbon County once for the crime of selling intoxicating liquors and have other cases pending against him. The crime for which he is now serving time was committed by him and a white woman, whom he afterwards married to keep her from testifying. The records show one of the rankest conditions of prostitution carried on in this man's place of business and off from every act of prostitution he received his pay.

In Carbon county if this man is granted any leniency of any kind or nature it will turn such men as he is loose on the public with the thought that there is no punishment for this sort of crime. Under such conditions the good people of this town will be at their mercy and the girls of this county and state will be beyond any protection from them. He and his type are bad and they are no good to this country; they are violators of the law and intend to continue to violate the law.

MAY I ASK AS A CITIZEN AND AS AN OFFICER  
THAT YOU AS A BOARD DENY HIS APPLICATION AND BY THIS DOING  
NOTIFY ALL SUCH AS HE, THAT THE LAW UPON WHICH HE WAS CON-  
VICTED IS TO BE ENFORCED.
