Application of Miss Nellie Trujillo No. 4510

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Termination

and respectfully represent as follows:

X First-That I ^{was} ~~am~~ serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison
under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Second degree murder

Second-I was convicted and sentenced on the 24th day of September
A. D. 1914, at Uernal Utah County of Quintah
and State of Utah, in District Court, in and for the

County and State aforesaid, Honorable Judge E. Hansen presiding.

Third-I was sentenced to from ten (10) years to life

and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison
for period of (3) three years, approx.

Fourth-Honorable Attorney M. B. Pope prosecuted the case.

Fifth-My true name in full is Nellie E. Trujillo

I was convicted under the name of Nellie E. Trujillo

Sixth-The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are
as follows: Ernest Trujillo, Harris Murray
and Elvora Wan

Seventh-I have never been convicted of any offense except the foregoing
Remarks (September 17th 1927 I was
first paroled. Violated parole six (6) wks
later, and was reimprisoned for ten
(10) months, reparaoled June 1928, and
feel my present status justifies this application.
