Application of Jack Dillon,

To the Honorable Board of Pardons of the State of Utah:

I hereby apply to your Honorable Body for a Conditional Termination of Sentence, and respectfully represent as follows:

First-- That I am serving a term of imprisonment in Utah State Prison, under conviction and a sentence on a charge of Grand Larceny.

Second-- I was convicted and sentenced on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of July A. D. 1924, at Salt Lake City County of Salt Lake and State of Utah, in District Court Court, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Honorable Ephraim Hansen presiding.

Third-- I was sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed ten years, and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison.

Fourth-- Honorable W. F. Hutchinson prosecuted the case.

Fifth-- My true name in full is J. F. Brown.

I was convicted under the name of Jack Dillon.

Sixth-- The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are as follows: Lewis Austin.

Seventh-- I have never been convicted of any offense except.

The condition I suggest is that I go to my home and people in Nashville, Tenn.
