TO THE HONORABLE GOVERNOR AND BOARD OF PARDONS,  
CITY.

Gentlemen:-

We, the undersigned citizens of Salt Lake City, Utah, join in petition and by these presents do petition your honorable body for the parole, release or pardon of George B. Morrison, now serving time in the Salt Lake County Jail under sentence from Judge Gailen S. Young's Court of sixty days in jail, thirty days of which was a suspended sentence, with a fine of \$299.00 for manufacturing and having possession of intoxicating liquors. October 6th, 1924 a stay of execution of the sentence was allowed during good behavior. In September 1925 Morrison was again arrested for illegal possession of liquor and tried Oct. 3d, 1925, ---found guilty and sentenced to serve for both sentences found against him a total of six months in jail, with 60 days granted as a suspension, and the two fines of \$299.00 each or a total of \$598.00. He commenced to serve time on Dec. 9th, 1925 and has now been incarcerated about 35 days.

Mr. Morrison has no means at the present time and is very deeply involved in debt with a first and second mortgage on his home with the accrued interest thereon unpaid for more than one year past. His general taxes for 1924 and 1925 are in arrears and unpaid. His family dependants upon him for support consist of his wife and four children.
