Second--I was convicted and sentenced on the Nineteenth day of January,
A. D. 1925., at Ogden, County of Weber,
and State of Utah, in 2nd. Judicial District Court, in and for the
County and State aforesaid, Honorable James M. Kimball, presiding.

Third--I was sentenced to One to twenty Years,
and thereafter was imprisoned in the Utah State Prison,

Fourth--Honorable Joseph E. Evans, prosecuted the case.

Fifth--My true name in full is Charles Haney,
I was convicted under the name of Charles Haney,

Sixth--The names of persons charged to have been connected with the same offense are
as follows: James Ryan, and Kenneth Gardner,

Seventh--I have never been convicted of any offense except Larceny, in Bucks
County, Pennsylvania. June 18th, 1917.

ion to furnish me with employment so that I may earn sufficient money
for transportation to my home, I now have sufficient fund for my trans-
portation to Denver, Colorado.
