In re Theos Owyhee
Application for Termination,

The above named, Theos Owyhee, was charged by the District Attorney of the Second Judicial District, in an information filed in the District Court of Said District, in and for Weber County, with the crime of Burglary in the third degree, alleged to have been committed as follows:


"The said defendant did then and there wilfully unlawfully and feloniously and burglariously break and enter a certain rooming house owned by one Jane Doe Burton and leased and occupied by one Robert Chambers, with intent to commit larceny. Contrary to the form of the Statute, etc."

To this information the defendant entered his plea of guilty, and having waived his statutory time, was on the 9th day of January, 1925, sentenced to a term of imprisonment in the State Prison for a period of not less than six months nor more than three years as provided by section 8262 of the Compiled Laws of Utah 1917.

Attached hereto and made a part hereof is a transcript of the proceedings had at the time judgment was pronounced, which contains a statement made by the defendant, and which is self-explanatory.

My recommendation is that the applicant should be required to serve not less than the minimum term of imprisonment prescribed by the Statute, to-wit, six months.
