THE COURT: Do you know how long they have been in Salt Lake City?

MR. ROGERS: No, they are not old timers here. They are strangers to the Police Department.

THE COURT: Come forward again, gentlemen. Do you want to make a statement, Mr. Ralph?

DEFENDANT RALPH: No, sir.

THE COURT: And you, Mr. Ledbetter?

DEFENDANT LEDBETTER: No, I have no statement, no sir.

THE COURT: You can do that if you wish to. A record will be made of it for the consideration of the Board of Pardons.

DEFENDANT LEDBETTER: It is my first offense.
